OFFERS COURSES OF THE FUTURE... The first Art Show took place in 1988 at Lincoln Consolidated Elementary School in the Heritage Room, directed by six art teachers. This was the first district—wide art show to take place for the community. There were 800–900 students participating, and over 1,000 pieces of artwork were displayed. This year the 1992 Lincoln Art show displayed over 900 pieces of art work by elementary, middle and high schools. These art exhibits continue to improve every year.
























